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## Greetings Community Members,

As the 2012-2013 school year comes to an end, we celebrate the accomplishments of our schools and the remarkable achievements of our students as they transition to the next phase of their education. On June 7, teachers, families, and friends celebrated as 160 graduates of St. Anthony Village High School's Class of 2013 walked across the stage with their diploma in hand and ready to embark upon their post-secondary plans. Earlier in the week, we recognized students in the Class of 2026 who finished two years of preschool at St. Anthony Community Services in preparation for kindergarten, fifth graders at Wilshire Park in the Class of 2020 who will be entering middle school, and eighth graders at St. Anthony Middle School in the Class of 2017 who are transitioning to high school.

We are proud of the remarkable achievements of our students and, as a small school district, we are grateful for our supportive community. The Class of 2013 was offered \$1.5 million in total college scholarships and received an additional \$44,000 in local scholarships. Sixty-two local scholarships were distributed at the annual awards ceremony on May 24. When parents, teachers, and community members work together on behalf of children, our students reap the benefits. At Wilshire Park Elementary School alone, 200 volunteers contributed 7,900 hours to support students, classroom activities, special events, and field trips. We are committed to ensuring our students have an extraordinary education.

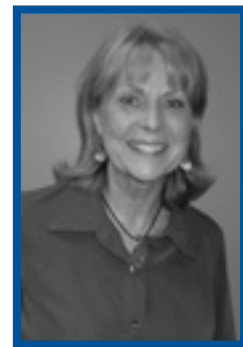

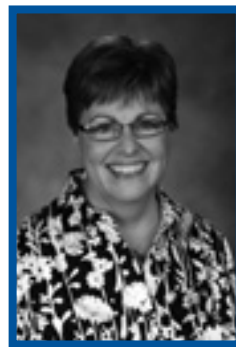

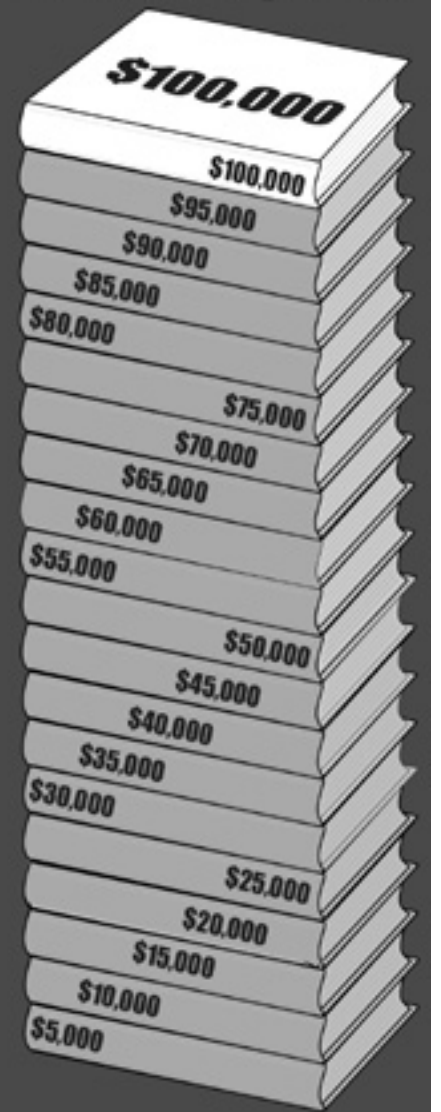
To support the St. Anthony-New Brighton School District's continuing commitment to academic excellence and opportunity by providing a permanent, long-range funding source.

## All-State Program

Minnesota Music Educators Association's (MMEA) All-State program develops the finest musicians and leaders among Minnesota's most accomplished high school students.

Each year, over 2000 students audition at sites throughout the state for the All-State performing groups: Bands (Concert & Symphonic), Choir (Men's, Mixed & Women's), Orchestra and Jazz Ensemble. After auditions, more than 575 students are selected to participate in the All-State summer camp experience.

## St. Anthony Village High School Ranks Among Top 10 Best High Schools in Minnesota

Newsweek announced the top 2000 public high schools in the nation and St. Anthony Village High School ranked 8th in the state. The 2013 list of America's Best High Schools focuses on "those that have proven to be the most effective in turning out college-ready graduates." St. Anthony Village High School was also recognized by Newsweek in 2012 and ranked 9th in the state and 389th in the nation. Newsweek ranks schools based on six criteria: graduation rate, college acceptance rate, Advanced Placement (AP) tests taken per student, percent of students enrolled in at least one AP course, average AP scores, and average SAT/ACT scores.

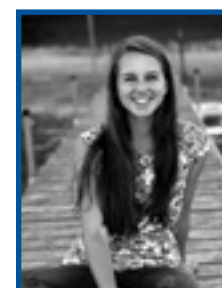
In 2013, 241 students at St. Anthony Village High School took 416 Advanced Placement (AP) exams; in 2012, 228 students took 396 AP exams.

U.S. News and World Report released its 2013 Best High Schools rankings and St. Anthony Village High School ranked 3rd in the state and 320th in the nation. St. Anthony Village High School was one of only six gold medal high schools in Minnesota to be recognized. U.S. News and World Report collected data on more than 21,000 public high schools in the nation to identify the country's top-performing public high schools. U.S. News & World Report partners with American Institutes for Research to compare individual school data to statewide proficiency data and determine the best high schools nationally according to the following criteria:

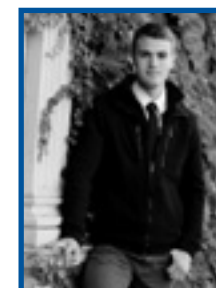
- Schools where students were performing better than statistically expected for the average student in the state.
- Schools where the least-advantaged students were performing better than average for similar students in the state.
- Schools which produced the best college-level achievement for the highest percentage of their students.

The report recognized 136 high schools in Minnesota--six gold medal schools, forty silver medal schools, and ninety bronze medal schools.

## Learning Locally, Acting Globally

For the fourth consecutive year, St. Anthony Middle School partnered with H2O for Life to help construct a well for a school in Africa. After a visit from Alephonsion Deng—one of the ‘Lost Boys of Sudan’—in November 2012, St. Anthony Middle School chose to dedicate this year’s project to Deng’s native country and partner with a school in South Sudan. The mission of H2O for Life is to educate, engage, and inspire youth to learn, take action, and become global citizens by connecting schools in the United States with schools in developing countries to construct a WASH (Water, Sanitation, and Hygiene) project. Sixth grade students completed research projects on the water crisis and all students in grades 6-8 acted upon that knowledge to make a difference in their world. St. Anthony Middle School established a goal to raise \$5,500 to construct a well for South Sudan School 5 and, through students’ efforts of coordinating a silent auction and seeking donations for their annual Water Walk Day, doubled their goal to raise a total of \$10,500. The additional \$5,000 will fund a second project in Africa, bringing clean water to all students and their families at another school. Since 2010, St. Anthony Middle School has raised over \$30,000 to provide WASH facilities at partner schools Nankanga Secondary School in Tanzania, Kirangari Primary School in Kenya, Mayamaya Primary School in Tanzania, and South Sudan School 5. ## Scholastic Art Awards

St. Anthony Middle School students **Lindsey Paulson**, **Tessa Quale**, and **Ryan Wettergren** were recognized in a regional competition of the Scholastic Art and Writing Awards. The Scholastic Art and Writing Awards, a national competition open to students in grades 7-12, is in its 90th year.

**Lindsey Paulson** received a Gold Key award at the regional competition for her work entitled “Flamingo Forest” and progressed to the national competition. Gold Key represents the highest level of achievement at the regional level and approximately 7-10% of all regional submissions are considered for the national competition.

**Tessa Quale** received a Silver Key award at the regional competition for her work entitled “Contour Shirt”. Silver Key represents the second highest level of achievement and 10-15% of regional submissions are recognized with this award.

**Ryan Wettergren** received an Honorable Mention at the regional competition for his work “Contour Jacket”. Honorable Mention recognizes students with artistic potential and 15-20% of regional submissions receive this award.

## St. Anthony-New Brighton School District's Preschool Rated Four Stars by Parent Aware

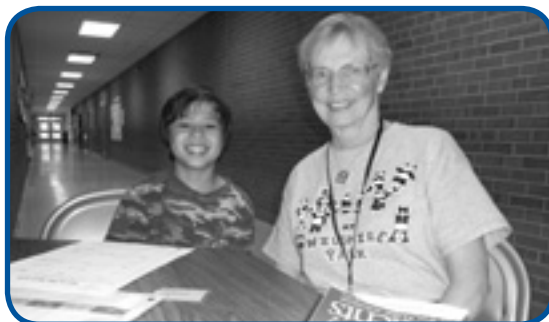
